

THE ANSA MCAL GROUP MID-YEAR FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR 2015



For the first six months of 2015, the ANSA McAL Group achieved revenue of \$2.8 billion and \$459 million profit before tax which resulted in an 11 percent improvement over the previous year.

Commenting on the Group's unaudited results for the six months ended June 30 2015, Group Chairman and Chief Executive, Mr. A Norman Sabga stated, "I think these results speak for themselves. Our Service Sector performed significantly better than last year. We believe in the next two months the media company will pick up."

Mr. Sabga, in his address at the Group's stockbrokers' meeting, described the financial results as a "mixed bag." He added, "Overall, in the market we find ourselves in, the results are not bad.

"With respect to the Automotive Sector, revenues are down but our percentage of the market has grown. That is how we measure an industry, the whole market is down but our share increased. Our beverage industries in the islands have done well. Barbados in particular is doing better than last year."

According to Mr. Sabga, the benefit of being a conglomerate is that when one of the sectors is down, others are growing. "Over the last 15 years we have demonstrated that year on year".

"We think of the glass as being half full rather than half empty and we believe there are a lot of efficiencies". Mr. Sabga explained, "In manufacturing we bought state of the art equipment and we experienced a learning curve with that. We are better off than we were but there is a long way to go," he said.

According to the unaudited results, earnings per share increased to \$1.75 and the directors have approved an interim dividend of 0.30 cents per share.

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A Will & A Way

On 26th August, 2015, Dr. Anthony N Sabga, the man described as the "Lord of the ANSA McAL Empire," revealed an inspiring story in his autobiography, "A Will and a Way". The book was launched at the Central Bank Auditorium, Port-of-Spain. It was written through a collaboration with Dr. Sabga, History Professor, Dr. Bridget Brereton and Author, Dr. Raymond Ramcharitar. "We interviewed Dr Sabga over a two-year period for a total of about 50 hours. We transcribed the interviews and then formed the skeleton of the main narrative. This is Dr Sabga's story, Raymond and I were there to put it in coherent text" said Dr. Brereton.

The book, dedicated to Dr. Sabga's wife Minerva, was officially launched by Commonwealth Secretary General, Sir Shridath Ramphal. The book tells of Dr. Sabga's difficulty when he started attending the Nelson Street Boys' RC School. "Much of what I experienced in that early part of my life shaped me in ways that still drive me. I still remember seeing children with other toys and luxuries we could not afford. That made a tremendous impression. Those days, those moments, were the seeds of my desire to achieve," he recalls.

He formed an unusually close bond with his father but said his inspiration to succeed came from both parents.

Dr. Brereton, who wrote a historical essay in the book, said Dr. Sabga was a true Trinidadian patriot who never left these shores even when business counterparts were doing so. Explaining why his story was relevant, she said he was one of the makers and shapers of post, World War II T&T. He was born in 1923 and there are few alive to tell about that era. His story is, intrinsically, a story of obstacles, triumphs, apparent failure and, above all, a story of a will and a way.

Sir. Shridath Ramphal said the Caribbean community was a constellation of migrants. Many came by physical force but almost all came by force of circumstances. 'A Will and a Way' is the story of one such remarkable man whose faith in life was to become synonymous with the development of Trinidad and Tobago and its rise in the Caribbean archipelago. He went on to say that Dr. Sabga sought release in this country from the bonds in which he was trapped and brought in himself so much that Trinidad and Tobago has been enriched by his coming.
